Professional Development

Karen Haggard reported on Summer PD: TASL CO-OP,

[&]quot;A membership reminder was sent to those marked lapsed in June.

[&]quot;The 2013 version of summer Professional Development for TASL, took place in Gatlinburg on June 18 and in Medina on June 20. Total attendance for the two events was close to 200 people. Our theme was "Cultivating School Libraries—Growing Lifelong Learners."

Our three main presenters were The Librarians in the Middle, 3 librarians from the Anderson school district in South Carolina. Tamara Cox, Monique German, and Kristen Hearne challenged our thinking and gave us new ideas in the sessions they presented: PD with a Twist, Sacred Cows, Learn to Love Nonfiction, Information Literacy Strategies, It's All About the Graphics, and What's a PLN and Why Would I Want One? Their joint keynote address on The Care and Feeding of Administrators called us to find out our principal's goal for the school and to make a difference around that goal.

Member presenters added their own great ideas to our day. Harvest Common Core Resources with TEL was presented at both locations (Sarah Searles in Gatlinburg and Tracy Parker in Medina). Other topics included Reaching Reluctant (Becky Jackman), Bursting with Flavor—Appetizing Library Activities and Events (Susan Harris), Battle of the Books and More (Jennifer Boren and McKenzie Weaver), Growing the Youngest Learners (Nathalie Wyss), Making a Connection: Using Online Multimedia Materials to Connect Students to Books (Deborah Parrott, Joanna Anderson, Renee Lyons), Weeding Your Crops (Karen Cragwall), and Bloom Where You're Planted: How VSBA Books Can Help Meet CCSS (Cindy Welch).

The day ended at each location with a chance to gather in grade level groups and share "crop advice". There was also much enthusiastic sharing of ideas during the day. At the end of the day, attendees received a certificate of participation and a mason jar with the TASL logo and these words of wisdom from Robert Louis Stevenson: "Don't judge each day by the harvest you reap, but by the seeds you plant."

It takes a lot of people to put on events like these. Our hostesses, Vickie McDowell in Gatlinburg and Amanda Anderson in Medina worked very hard to make us feel welcome. Others arranged for food, facilitated sessions, decorated to follow our theme, checked in attendees and passed out certificates. I can't begin to express my appreciation to all who made these events successful. Watch for opportunities to volunteer for next summer's event.

I think everyone who has attended our TASL summer PD would agree that its value is well worth setting aside one day of summer to attend. Having it in June this year hopefully gives us a little more time to absorb new learning and to implement new ideas.

My favorite comment from the evaluations was, "My evaluation suggested that I become a more involved leader—Great Keynote!" (I related to that because my evaluator said the same thing.) But I think TASL CO-OP participants will agree that we have some great new tools in our toolbox to help us do just that in the coming school year.

There were a few Mason jars left. These will be available at Conference for \$5"

Technology Committee

Holly Matthews sent an update for handbook. The committee is continuing with TASL Facebook efforts and other technology related matters.

VSBA

Scot Smith submitted the VSBA report electronically. It stated,

- "1) The nomination committee chairs are: Pat Shaffer of the Nashville Public Library (Primary), Renee Ward of Franklin City Schools (Intermediate), and Lee Hope of the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Public Library (Middle and High School). Several of the committees are still looking to add readers. The committees have started to create the first round of nominations for the 2015-2016 lists.
- 2) Renee Ward has suggested that TASL create a certificate of participation for the members of the nomination committee. This certificate would serve as part of the professional development portfolio for the evaluation rubric for the librarians on the reading committees. I think this is a wonderful idea. The members on the committees spend countless hours and reading for VSBA and a good deal of their own money purchasing books.
- 3) All the promotional materials have been posted on the TASL web site. We have had more confusion than usual over the lists because titles are going out of print sooner, and several titles had to be replaced at the last minute.
- 4) I am working on contacting authors for books for the silent auction. Hopefully, we will have 40 or more titles for the auction.
- 5) As for the 2013 awards banquet, I should have acceptance letters from Wendy Mass and James Dashner. I have not been able to contact Carol Buckley, author of Tarra & Bella, winner of the primary award. Does anyone at TASL have a connection with her? Maybe Hannah? She lives in Middle TN.
- 6) I have contacted the winners of the 2013 VSBA about the 2014 conference. I believe Sharon Draper has accepted our invitation. I believe both Kirby Larson and Mary Nethery would like to attend. I am not sure about Ally Condie. No hope for Rick Riordan....he will send us a wonderful acceptance letter.
- 7) For the 2013 conference, Susan Timmons and I will present the middle and high school nominations in a breakout session. I am not sure who from the primary and intermediate committees will do their presentations. I will check with Renee and Pat to verify the presenters."

Beth Frerking had drafted a letter in reaction to recent incidents in the State that had been brought to the Board's attention by Tullahoma librarians. The Board discussed and revised the language and the tone of this letter to reflect our advocacy position.

Karen Haggard **MOVED** we empower our president to address the Tullahoma City Schools' librarian job cuts and future similar incidences by sending a letter to appropriate governing bodies as a way of advocating for library positions. Seconded by Cristol Kapp. **MOTION** passed (M-AUG2013-3).

This letter will be sent via snail mail and we will accommodate future requests in regard to this issue.

The advocacy conversation needs to be on-going and we need to generate proactive ideas to promote the need for librarians to avoid being in a reactive position.

Goal #4: Work with Teacher/Administrator preparation programs:

- Action: Create a task force to create a presentation template. (Suggested participants: Allison Maynard, Alice Bryant, Kanina Davis, Holly Matthews, Shannon Minner). Their charge: Create a presentation template to be used by librarians presenting in teacher/administrator preparation programs. The presentation should demonstrate the crucial role of the librarian as part of the educational team. (Beth)
- Future Action: Identify programs and contacts within the programs
- Future Action: Form and train a cadre of people to speak

Goal #5: Improving recognition of our Outstanding Administrators:

• Action: Notify peers (e.g. Press release to professional journal). Add this to awards committee's charge (Beth)

The name in parenthesis is the person who is going to follow up on it.

Retired Librarians Reach Out

Cristol Kapp volunteered to explore ways to encourage retired librarians to stay active in TASL. Joy Branham was suggested as a recent retiree to help develop this idea.

Treasurer's Computer
