

2016 TASL Innovative Library Media Award

School librarians have developed outstanding creative programs and should be honored for these dynamic ideas. This TASL award recognizes an innovative program at the elementary, middle, and high school level that has been implemented during the current school year. For the purpose of this award, a *program* is defined as a plan of action designed to meet a specific need while promoting reading or library media services. *Innovative* is defined as being outside the normal practice. Participation in the program should be voluntary and not part of the scheduled library instruction.

The school librarian who developed and implemented the innovative program must submit the award application. All TASL members are eligible. As part of the criteria for entry, the winning participant agrees to present the idea for his/her entry in a 10-minute presentation during a session at the TASL conference. Each award recipient will receive \$500 at the annual TASL conference (November 3-5 in Murfreesboro). If there are no applications meeting the criteria, no award will be presented.

All submissions become the property of TASL and will not be returned.

Wireless Internet Access for Conference Attendees-Misti Jenkins
